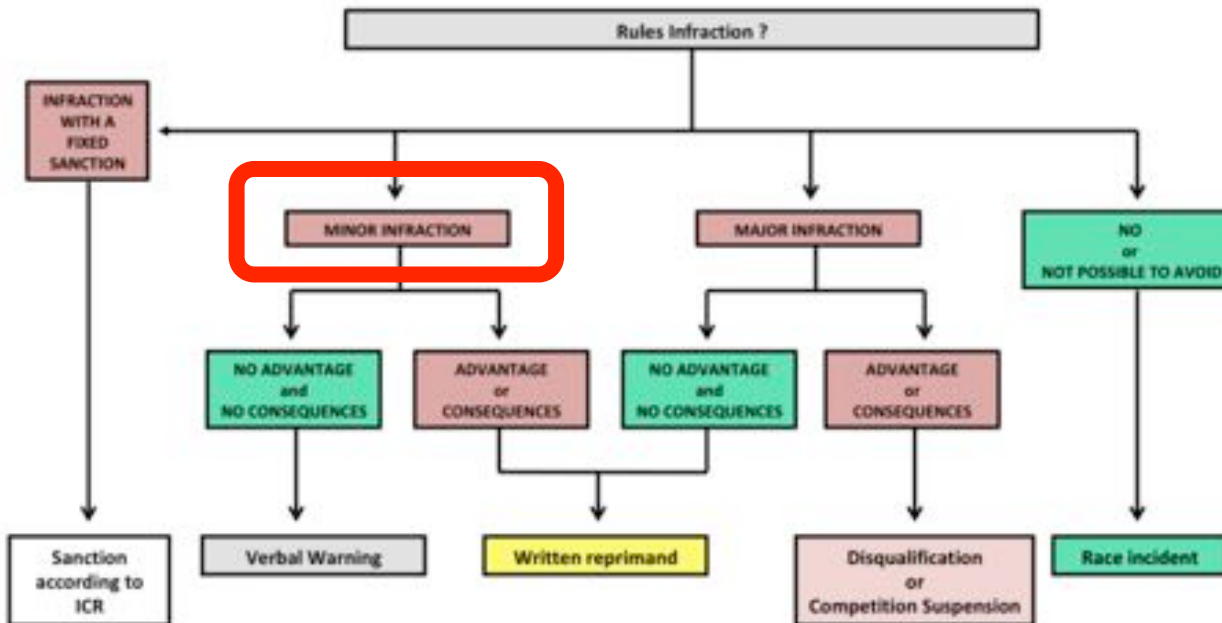

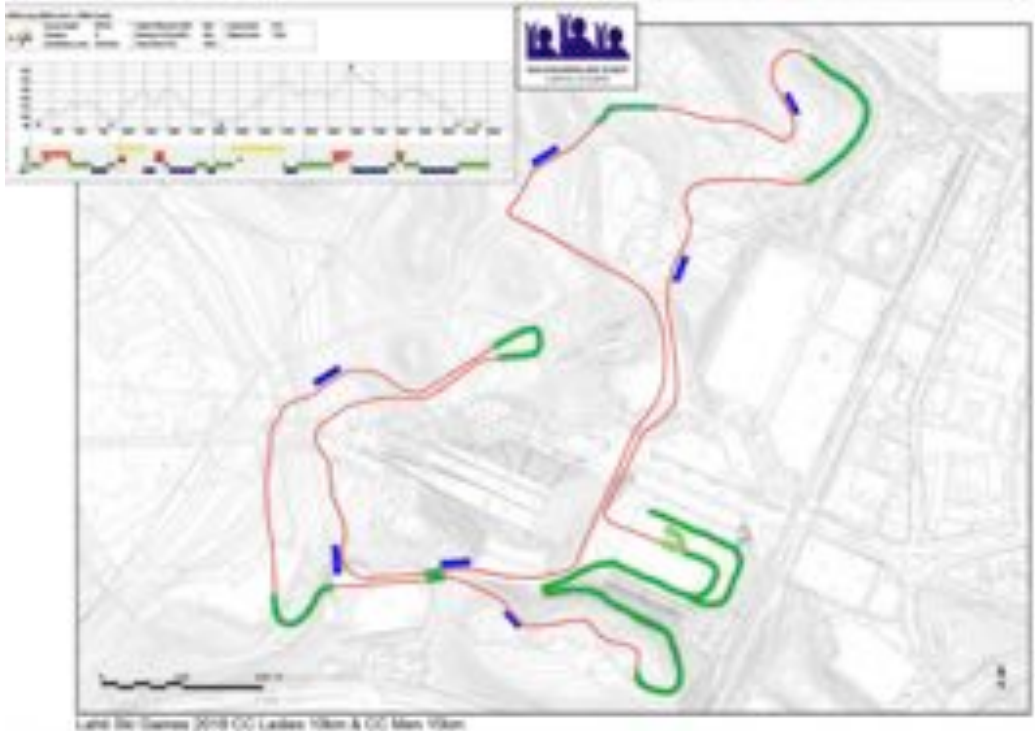


- Classic Technique is our biggest problem. (Violations include Turning and Technique Zones.

Violations with Fixed Sanction



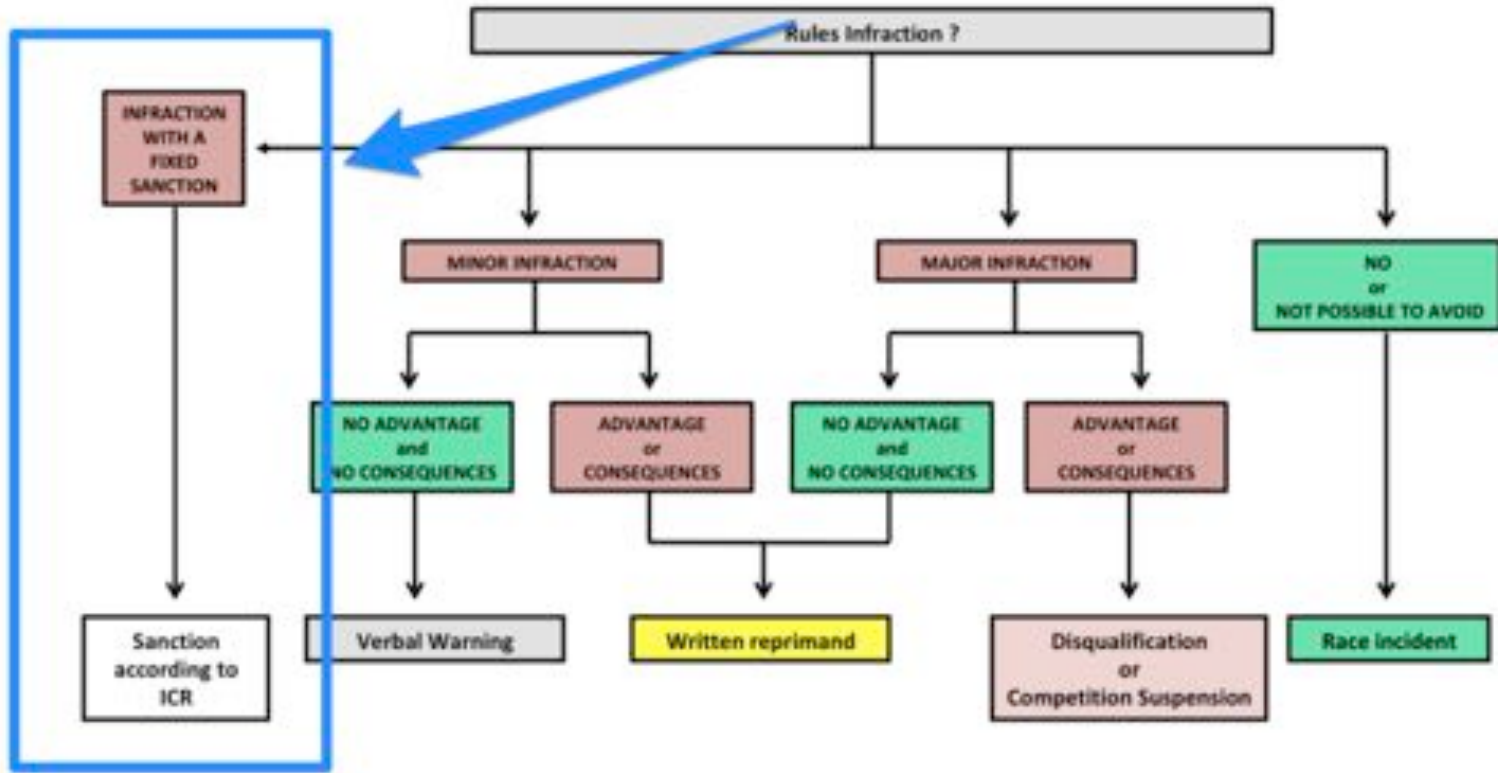
325.4.2.9 Any competitor who causes a False Start will be sanctioned by a written reprimand. Following the first False Start in a heat, any competitor who causes a subsequent False Start in the same heat will be required to withdraw from the competition.

352.4.1.1 In Interval Start competitions or Sprint qualifications, early start infractions should be sanctioned by a minimum time penalty of 15 seconds (the competitor's actual skiing time + 15 seconds minimum penalty).

352.4.1.2 In competitions with Pursuit Start, early start infractions should be sanctioned by a time penalty equal to the time gained (posted start time minus actual start time) + 30 seconds minimum penalty.

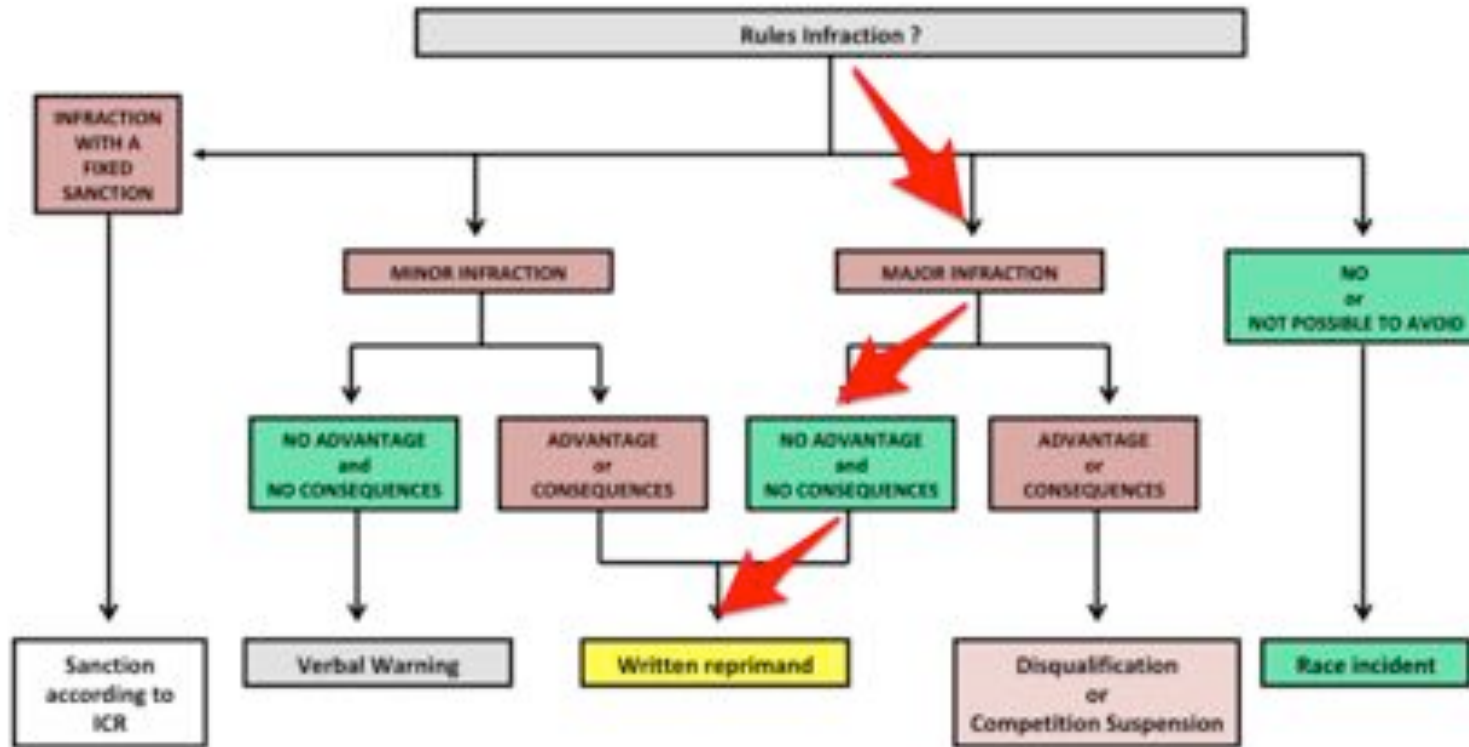

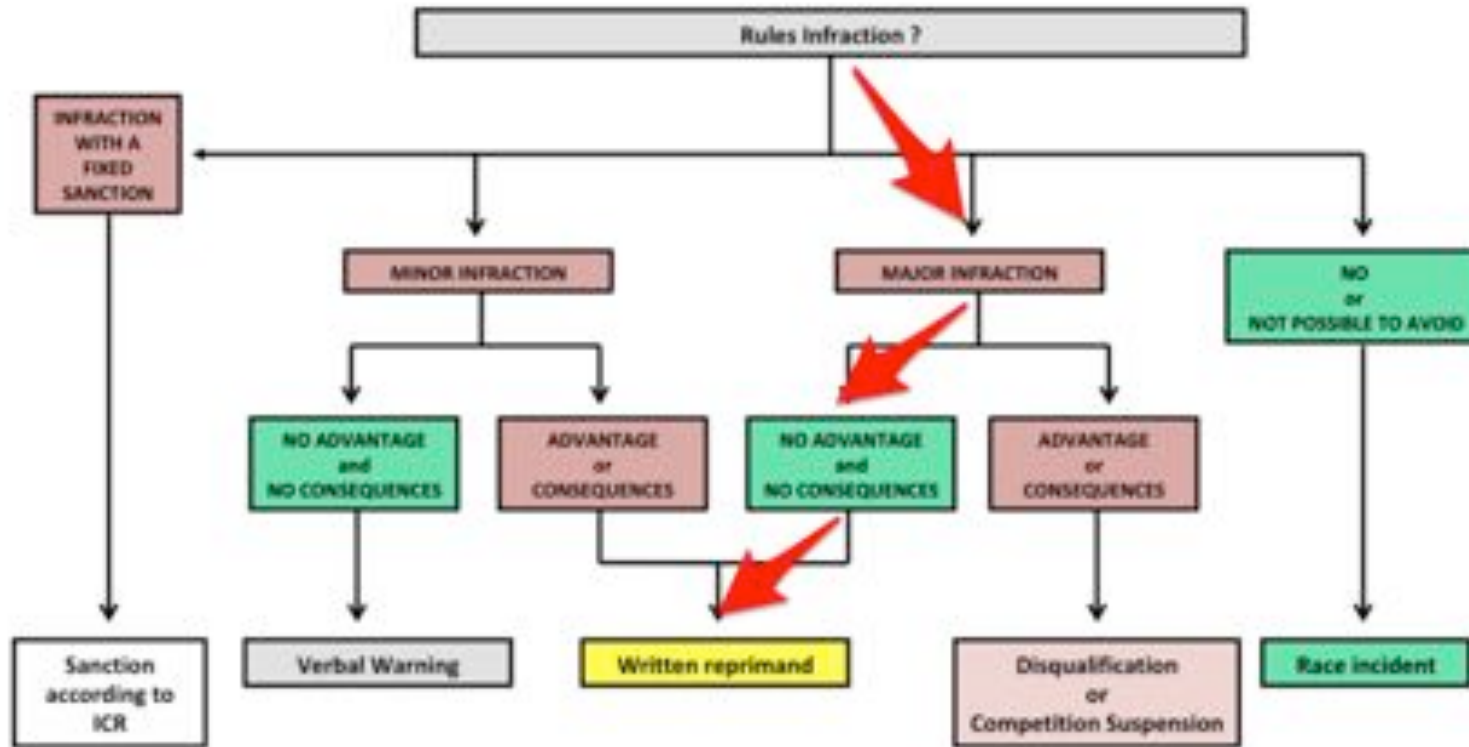

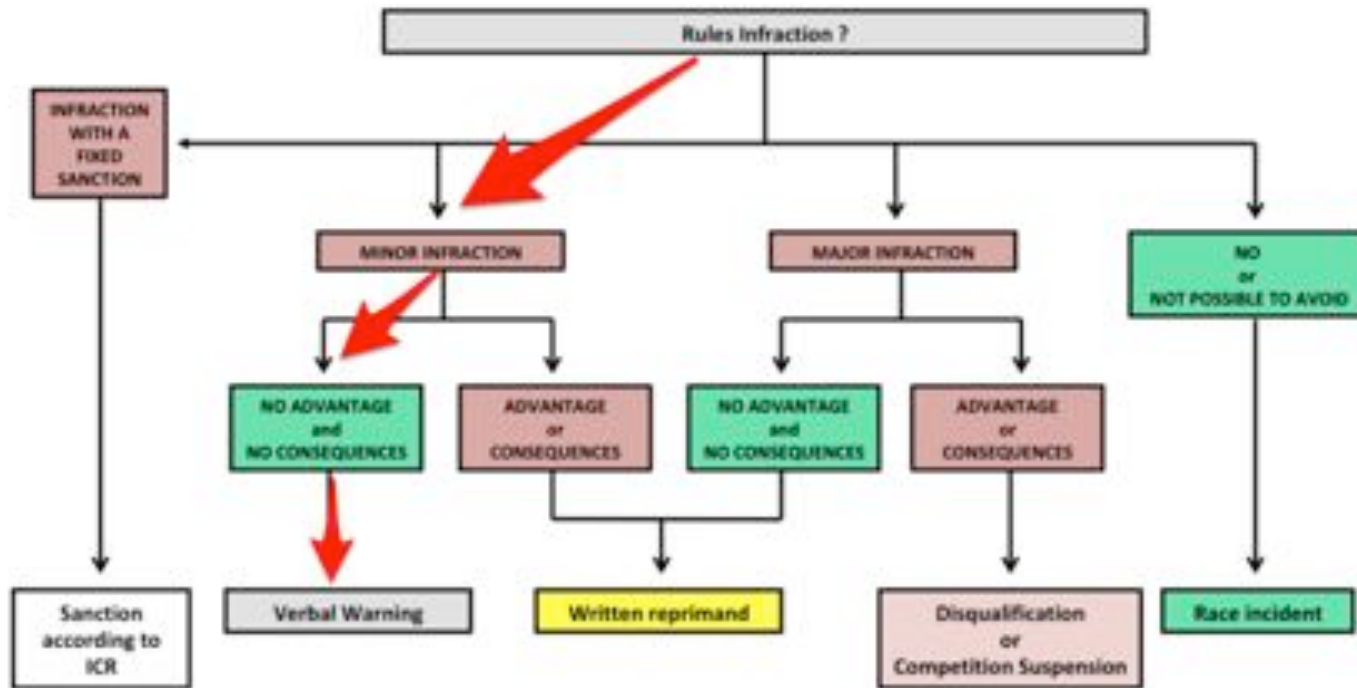


Technique Zone

Timing & Technical Data Report



302.3.4

The chief of timekeeping and data processing is responsible for the direction and coordination of the officials working in the timing area (starter, finish referee, finish controller, manual timers, electronic timers, intermediate timekeepers and calculations officials' work). The chief of timekeeping and data processing oversees the preparation of the Timing and Data Technical Report (TDTR) and xml file for the electronic transmittal to FIS following the competition. A copy of the report may also be printed (only if the TD has no access to his report) for review prior to the transmission of the xml file. The TDTR Software can be found on the FIS website.

Expanded Definition of Expenses



304.1.1

The competition officials have a right to reimbursement for ~~their~~ all appointment related travel expenses (including but not limited to airfare, baggage fees, car rental or mileage, airport transfer, visa, health insurance, airport parking and highway taxes ~~included~~), as well as free accommodation and meals during the assignment. This rule also applies to agreed inspections as well as the trip to the competition (train, first class; for longer distances air fare, tourist class; or payment of a per kilometer fee of CHF 0.70 or equivalent). In addition a fixed daily rate of CHF 100 net is added for the travel days to and from, as well as each day of the assignment, which includes postage charges for mailing reports, etc. Double charges (e.g. travelling home on the same day as the last race) are not permitted. If overnight accommodation during the journey to and from the assignment is necessary, this must be justified and reimbursed separately.

310.2.2 Classical Technique

310.2.2.1 Classical technique includes the ~~diagonal~~ Diagonal Stride techniques, the double poling ~~techniques with or without diagonal kick~~, herringbone ~~techniques~~ without a gliding phase, ~~downhill techniques~~ and turning techniques.

310.2.2.2 Diagonal Stride technique is comprised of alternating diagonal movements of both arms and legs and includes diagonal stride and herringbone techniques without a gliding phase. In diagonal technique only one or no pole is in the ground at any time.

Correct Definition of Maximum Climb

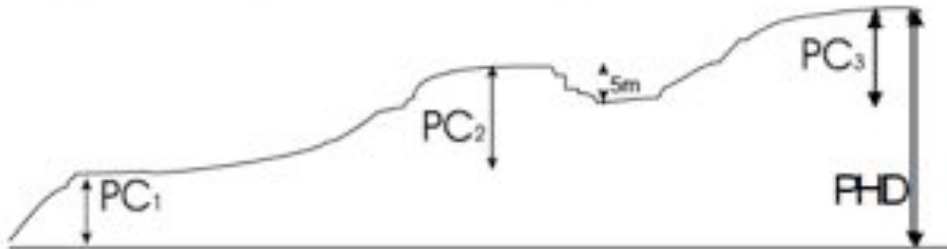


311.2.4.2

MC (Maximum climb) is the climb with the highest ~~total climb height~~ partial height difference (PHD), in other terms, the biggest uphill. The uphill can be interrupted by a section of undulating terrain that does not exceed 200 m in length or a downhill that does not exceed 10 m PHD.

Partial Height Difference (PHD)

PHD is used to calculate the average gradient of the climb ($\text{PHD} \times 100 / \text{distance}$)



Refined Procedure for Interval Start



315.2 Interval Start Procedure

- 315.2.1 Interval Starts will normally use half-minute intervals and fifteen seconds for sprint qualifying round. The Jury may approve shorter or longer intervals.
- 315.2.2 The start command consists of a countdown starting 5 seconds before the start time ("5-4-3-2-1") and start signal ("GO!"). The command can be given verbally or by audible signals.
- 315.2.3 The competitor must have his feet behind the start line, ~~and remain stationary before the starter gives starting commands.~~ The poles ~~remain stationary and~~ must be placed in front of the starting line and/or starting gate.

Refined Procedure for Heat Start



315.5 Heat Start procedure

315.5.1 The start area is prepared with a start line and a pre-start line that are 1 meter apart.

315.5.2 Electronic and/or mechanical start gates can be used if approved by the Jury.

315.5.2.1 Use of start gates is mandatory at OWG, WSC, WC, U23 WSC and JWSC competitions.

315.5.3 Competitors are organized on the pre-start line where instructions are given and start lanes designated. The starter will give the command **"take your start positions"** and the competitors advance to the start line where they must place their poles behind the start line and/or start gates. When all competitors are at the start line, the starter will give the command **"Set"** and all the competitors must remain motionless until the starter gives the start signal.

Procedure

352.1.1

When an infraction to the rules occurs, the Jury must meet and decide the appropriate sanction by taking into consideration:

- the specific circumstances
- the gain or advantage for the offender (see ICR art. 223.3.3)
- the negative impact on other competitors
- the impact on the final result or intermediate results (sprint heats or bonus sprints)
- ~~the arguments from the athlete (see ICR art 224.7)~~
- the level of the competition
- the age and experience of the competitors
- the guidelines for Jury work published on the FIS Website

352.1.2

A hearing of the offender (ICR 224.7) may be organised:

- on demand of the jury if necessary
- on demand of the offender in case of submission of a protest according to ICR 361.

Competition Suspension Extended to Popular Competitions



352.3 Competition suspension

352.3.1 Competition suspension can only be used for ICR infractions during sprint heats, team sprint heats, ~~and~~ bonus sprints (both intermediate and finish) and popular competitions.

352.3.2 In Sprint competitions, a competition suspension means that the competitor will be ranked last in the heat and last in the round (6th for final, 12th for 1/2 finals and 30th for 1/4 finals).

352.3.3 In Mass Start or Skiathlon competitions, a competition suspension means that the competitor will be relegated out of the result of a bonus sprint.

352.3.4 In popular competitions, suspension means that the competitor is ranked on last rank and his/her time is not published.

Advance Changes



- Changes in the competitions known before the expected arrival of the Teams (normally greater than two days prior) reported to FIS via Competition Services Coordinator.

- Events that are already on the FIS Calendar can add competitions after the Calendar Deadline
- TD should be informed/involved.
- SuperTour and National Championships changes involve Sport Development Manager. bryan.fish@usskiandsnowboard.org

Changes on Site



- Homologation numbers are now entered upon calendaring and automatically populated in the FIS TD report.
- It is possible to substitute with a different course with Homologation Certificate.
- In special cases, if the competition will be carried out on a non-homologated substitute course, the Technical Delegate (TD) has to confirm the norms of the course according to ICR article 311.

- Verify the correct results are “scored” by U.S. Ski & Snowboard for National &/or FIS by checking the website(s)
- Submit TD report to FIS &/or U.S. Ski & Snowboard

Checking National & FIS Numbers



- ALL Events **require** a **valid** U.S. Ski & Snowboard &/or FIS license for every athlete in the race
- 90% + athletes will be on the most recent US National or FIS list
- The US National list includes the FIS number for all U.S. Ski & Snowboard members that we know about.
- The FIS list supplied by Competition Services lists the U.S. Ski & Snowboard numbers for FIS athletes that are U.S. Ski & Snowboard members
- If an athlete does not appear on a list than they **MUST** be checked either with U.S. Ski & Snowboard or FIS websites to see if they became active after the list was run

Scored Results



- U.S. Ski & Snowboard will send an email to the TD and Timer once results are submitted to FIS.
- Once scored to FIS, TD needs to verify results are correct before submitting their report. Use athletes in event numbers that match the FIS site!
- U.S. Ski & Snowboard will notify the Timer and TD when results are scored to the NRL. TD needs to verify these results, confirming that the proper penalty and min/max have been applied. A FIS race will have a different penalty when scored to the NRL.

FIS List Closing Date



- We have until open for Business in Switzerland on Tuesday after a FIS List Closes.
- It is CRITICAL to get the results submitted ASAP after the competition is completed.
- It is CRITICAL that the TD and someone from the organizing committee check the results on the FIS site
- The Results must be correct on the FIS site by 8:00 AM Swiss time (2 AM Mountain Time) Tuesday after the close date (a Sunday)
- The TD Report must be submitted to FIS by 8:00 AM Swiss time.
- Otherwise the results will not be included on the next FIS list.

Make sure to check the following



- ✓ Only Active FIS and U.S. Ski & Snowboard numbers are allowed
- ✓ Use FIS names, not nicknames.
- ✓ It is the athletes responsibility to submit a valid FIS & National numbers.
- ✓ If an inactive FIS athlete accidentally gets submitted to FIS, then U.S. Ski & Snowboard (or their national governing body) gets charged for their membership.
- ✓ If an athlete is left off, then their governing body will contact FIS and we have to explain why they were missed.

Make sure to check the following



- ✓ FIS Codes on all Reports! Entry/Seed List, Start List, & Result List
- ✓ Checking the submitted electronic data more important than than paper copies.
